VetCert Program History

Certification Transfer from the VA





- Firms verified by the VA Center for Verification and Evaluation (CVE) as of January 1, 2023, were automatically granted certification by SBA for the remainder of the firm's eligibility period.
- SBA granted a one-time, one-year extension of certification to current VOSBs and SDVOSBs verified by the VA as of the transfer date on January 1, 2023. This additional year will be added to the existing eligibility period of a current participant.
- New applicants certified by SBA after January 1, 2023, will receive the standard threeyear certification period.

VetCert Program History

Grace period for self-certified firms



- The NDAA 2021 had granted a one-year grace period for self-certified SDVOSBs until January 1, 2024. During the grace period, self-certified businesses had one year to file an application for SDVOSB certification and was allowed to rely on their self-certification to compete for non-VA SDVOSB set-aside contracts.
- ❖ Self-certified SDVOSBs that had applied before January 1, 2024, will maintain their eligibility through the expiration of the grace period until SBA issues a final eligibility decision.
- VOSBs and SDVOSBs seeking sole-source and set-aside opportunities with the VA must be certified – there is no grace period.

Benefits of Certification

Benefits of SBA certification¹



- Certification allows SDVOSB firms the opportunity to compete for sole-source and set-aside contracts across the federal government.
- Certified VOSBs and SDVOSBs should start the application process before their extended certification expiration date to ensure their certification does not lapse. Self-certified SDVOSBs are encouraged to submit an application in advance to ensure the certification process is complete by January 1, 2024.

Veteran Affairs (VA) Vets First Contracting Program²



- Created for Veteran-Owned Small Businesses (VOSB) & expanded the Service-Disabled Veteran contracting program for VA procurements.
- Opportunities for VA sole-source & set-aside contracts for certified VOSB & SDVOSB firms note: Certification required for both VOSB & SDVOSB

Eligibility Requirements

Eligibility requirements:



To apply for certification with SBA as a VOSB or SDVOSB, a firm must meet the following requirements:

- Be considered a small business, as defined by the size standard corresponding to any NAICS code listed in the business's SAM profile.
- Have no less than 51% of the business owned and controlled by one or more veterans.
- For certification as a SDVOSB, have no less than 51% of the business owned and controlled by one or more veterans rated as service-disabled by the VA.
- For those veterans who are permanently and totally disabled and unable to manage the daily business operations of their business, their business may still qualify if their spouse or appointed, permanent caregiver is assisting in that management.
- For a full list of eligibility requirements, see the final rule published in the Federal Register.


VetCert Application Readiness

To be application ready:


- Entity registration must be up to date and active in SAM.gov. To link your SAM profile to the application you will need:
 - Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)
 - Bank Account Number must match SAM profile!

- Make sure the have the supporting documents as .pdf files on your computer
- Be able to answer (with narrative if needed):










































VetCert Portal - Application

Completing the Owner(s) Questionnaire

Each owner listed will be required to complete a questionnaire and sign the document via DocuSign.

- ❖ Each owner will be sent an email with a link to sign into either the VetCert portal or if the owner has an open/current loan they will sign in via MySBA Loan Portal website (https://lending.sba.gov)
- For the majority owner(s), the questionnaire will require:
 - ✓ Job Title & description of work experience and history
 - ✓ Description of day to day business roles and duties of the company
 - Determine if there is a conflict of interest with outside employment or other full time employment
- Each owner will be required to upload a personal resume
- Once all owners have signed the questionnaire, the application will automatically be submitted for evaluation.









VetCert Portal – Approval Process

Application is submitted - what's next?

- Most applicants receive determination within 4 to 6 weeks.
- SBA analyst will conduct a full review of the responses and uploaded documentation.
 - After initial review, the applicant may receive an email with requests for additional documentation or clarification. It is important to watch your email for communication from the VetCert team! Be sure to respond within the required timeline. Non-response may result with your application be withdrawn by SBA
- A formal letter is issued once a decision is rendered.





Maintaining Certification


After receiving notification of certification

Check your DSBS profile to see if your SDVOSB or VOSB certification date is listed and "yes" box is checked



- Compliance "reporting" is once a year recertification in three years
- Start marketing your certification! Add the logo and certification information to your website and other marketing materials







Is this a good fit at this time?

However, is this program right for your business at this time?

- After January 1, 2024, certification is required to be eligible for SDVOSB or VA VOSB set-aside and sole-source solicitations.
- Certification considerations:
 - Unlike the 8(a) Program, you do not need to be in business a minimum length of time
 - Compliance "reporting" is once a year recertification in three years
 - Certification doesn't have a time limit as long as program eligible
 - VOSB Certification allows for sole-source opportunities for VA contracts
